Drive-thru Communion will be offered from 11:00 am to Noon on Easter Sunday.



Easter Offering for Shelter, Inc. Will be collected on Easter Sunday, April 4!

Through our Easter offering, we can express our love and compassion by reaching out to our neighbors who need a helping hand. The Outreach

Commission has selected <u>Shelter, Inc.</u> to receive our Easter offering this year because of the effective services they offer to provide housing and supportive services to those who struggle to put a roof over their heads.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Shelter, Inc. has stepped up to provide two important emergency programs funded by the CARES Act and other federal sources. Since last April, they have been operating a temporary 65-SRO (single room occupancy) homeless shelter in a converted motel in Concord. Shelter, Inc. has also been Contra Costa County's primary distributor of federal emergency rental and utility assistance to households with children or senior citizens that have been impacted by COVID-19.

Shelter, Inc. believes that housing is a human right, and its mission is to prevent and end homelessness for low-income, homeless, and disadvantaged families and individuals by providing housing, services, support, and resources that lead to self-sufficiency. Shelter, Inc. does this by:

<u>Preventing Homelessness:</u> Homeless prevention makes good sense economically, but in human terms, the results are invaluable. Eviction prevention programs help families and singles who are experiencing a crisis and are at risk of becoming homeless. Keeping people in their homes means that jobs are retained, families are fed, and children are safe. By providing one-time financial assistance for move-in and stay-in costs, Shelter, Inc. can prevent homelessness and help people take steps toward stability. Prevention services include rental assistance, a needs assessment, and financial goal setting with a case manager.

Ending the Cycle of Homelessness: Homeless families and individuals are provided housing plus services including employment, education, counseling, and household budgeting to help regain self-sufficiency and permanent homes. Many of us at DCC are familiar with Shelter, Inc's Mountain View Family Emergency Shelter in Martinez, where, for many years, our members have provided dinners several nights each year. Pandemic safety considerations have prevented faith groups and other volunteers from preparing and serving dinners as before, so you can think of your Easter offering this year as providing Shelter, Inc. with the financial means to provide the shelter dinners that we would otherwise be providing in person.


<u>Providing Affordable Housing</u>: Shelter, Inc. owns or master leases hundreds of units throughout the county, renting to low-income vulnerable residents, many of whom have otherwise been unable to find housing, such as disabled persons and veterans.

An Update from Dayspring

Dayspring Preschool is Thriving!



Sonna Dhamrait, the Director of Dayspring, continues to transform the school into a safe and loving environment for children, parents, and teachers, along with offering an exceptional curriculum and learning environment. In just 3 months, Sonna has initiated many changes which align with the mission and values that Dayspring represents. One parent recently called Dayspring "an oasis of support and calm" for his family. Sonna has been building staff skills and capacity through an intentional emphasis on ongoing professional

learning, including the topics of anti-racism, developmentally appropriate curriculum, and effective use of our new technology communication and management platform, Brightwheel.

In February we launched our Inclusion Program, to ensure we can diligently meet the needs of our varied student population. Here is what was presented to the

Dayspring families:

Inclusion News — What is Inclusion? Inclusion means that every child has access to, participates meaningfully in, and experiences positive outcomes from early childhood education and childcare programs. Why are we adding inclusion into the curriculum for Dayspring? Research reveals that students of all abilities who attend inclusive early childhood programs are better equipped to learn, live, and work in communities. What are the benefits of Inclusion? The benefits of inclusion are numerous, not only for children with special needs and their families but for all children. When we include all children in inclusion programs, they learn acceptance of other people, and that each person has unique abilities. Children learn from each other. With inclusion in place, children with special needs are provided an equal opportunity to participate in the same types of programs and activities as typically developing children. Some of the benefits of inclusion for all children are friendship skills, peer models, problem-solving skills, positive self-image, and respect for others.

Due to the pandemic, Dayspring has had to limit enrollment as County Public Health restricts the number of students we can have in a classroom. We have had an increase in the total number of students from 54 to 62 in the last month. We expect to add more students if the county increases the classroom size. We are seeing lots of enthusiasm from our current families for the summer school program, especially for the Intensive Kindergarten program for students getting ready for Kindergarten in the fall. Sonna is busy giving tours for summer and fall enrollment and expects to be full.
