Next Week: Graduates Sunday, May 17



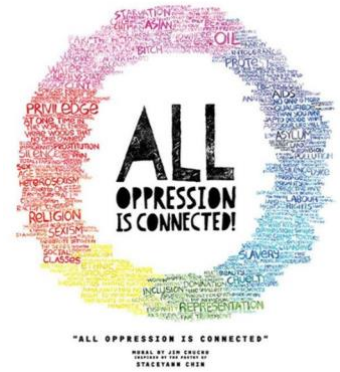

- **Imagine Beyond Empire: Spiritual Practices to Unlearn Oppression**

Sponsored by the Northern California Nevada Conference of the UCC, this 6-week online course taught by Pacific School of Religion professor Dr. Sharon R. Fennema, invites us into the profound work of understanding the multiple overlapping forms of oppression we often inadvertently participate in perpetuating and developing spiritual practices that enable us to take an honest look at ourselves and to imagine ways of living beyond these oppressive dynamics. We are all imbedded within and act out of systems that are based on the unjust exercise of power or authority. These oppressive actions and systems diminish us, divide us, and inhibit the full manifestation of God's love and justice in this world. To, this course is designed to:

- develop deeper understanding of the dynamics of oppression(s)
- introduce anti-oppression practices
- cultivate spiritual practices to sustain and advance this life-long work.
