The "you/your" mentioned in every stanza is never identified, but this 1979 hymn is clearly a corporate prayer to God on behalf of the diverse congregation who have assembled for worship, longing to be transformed and used as God's witnesses and for God's purposes.

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.
He makes me lie down in green pastures;
he leads me beside still waters;
he restores my soul.
He leads me in right paths
for his name's sake.
Even though I walk through the darkest valley,
I fear no evil,
for you are with me;
your rod and your staff,
they comfort me.
You prepare a table before me
in the presence of my enemies;
you anoint my head with oil;
my cup overflows.
Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me
all the days of my life,
and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord
my whole life long.

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne and to the Lamb!"

And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, singing,

"Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom
and thanksgiving and honor
and power and might
be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one who knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

For this reason they are before the throne of God
and worship him day and night within his temple,
.....and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.
They will hunger no more and thirst no more;
the sun will not strike them,
nor any scorching heat,
for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd,
and he will guide them to springs of the water of life,
and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.”

Supporting Students in our Sister Parish Community from farms to Universities!

On our last Sister Parish delegation to Guatemala, we brought a Guatemalan linguist who has led an organization to support education of indigenous, as well as summer programs to support linguistic and cultural education of the 23 different indigenous linguistic groups in that country. We brought him to our community in San Antonio to present to them the possibility of enrolling some of their students in high school or university, a concept that is challenging to a community that depends on agriculture, and families that depend on their children to work in the fields and around the house to sustain their living.

What he offered them through Aid-in-Education was a level of scholarship help to cover 1/2 of their educational expenses. Aid-in-Education solicits support from the North to make this possible, and Ajpub himself [a university professor] administers the funds to the students and provides their grades to supporters to see their progress.

Seven students signed up for the program. Now four are attending universities, and one is in the last year of high school. These five students from our Sister Parish community all need our continued support. The level that Aid-in-Education offers is \$1,000 per year for university students and \$700 for high school. Those funds cover about 1/2 the costs, including transportation, tuition, books, and exams. Sometimes even appropriate clothing is a necessary expense.
