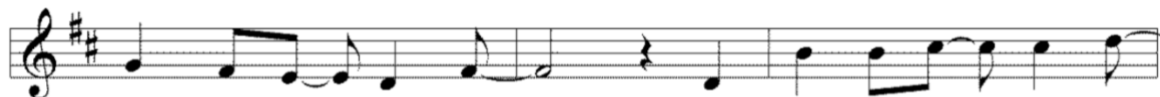

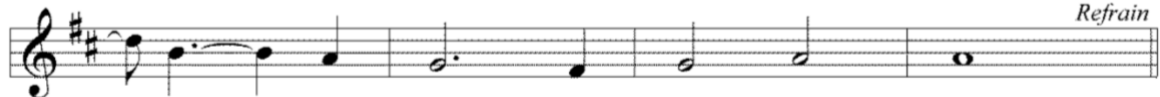

SCRIPTURE LESSON

[Selections from Galatians 5](#)

Christ has made us free so that we can be really free! So be strong and do not turn back.

My Christian friends, God has chosen you to serve him as free people. But you are still weak and human. So you are not free to do anything that you might want to do. Instead, you must serve one another, because you love each other. One rule brings together all the rules in God's Law. That one rule says: 'Love other people as much as you love yourself.' So you must not live like wild animals. Wild animals fight and they eat each other. If you live like that, be very careful! You may destroy one another completely.

So this is what I say: Let God's Spirit show you how to live in a good way. Then you will not do the wrong things that you may want to do, as people who are weak and human. The things that you want to do as a weak person are opposite to the things that God's Spirit wants. The things that God's Spirit wants are the opposite of what we want as weak people. Our own thoughts fight against what God's Spirit wants us to do. As a result, you are not free to do the things that you really want to do. But if God's Spirit leads you, then the rules of God's Law have no authority over you.

Everyone knows the kinds of bad things that weak people want to do. They do things that are bad and disgusting. They worship idols. They do magic to hurt people. They become enemies and they fight one another. They are jealous of other people. They become very angry. They want to please themselves and to be important. They cause trouble. They make people belong to different groups. They want things that belong to other people. And they like to do many other bad things like those. So I warn you again, as I have already warned you before. People who continue to do any of those bad things will not receive good things from God. God has prepared those good things for the people who belong to his kingdom.

But God's Spirit causes us to live in a different way. We love other people. We are happy and we have peace in our minds. We are patient, kind and good. People can trust us to do what is right. We respect other people and we rule ourselves properly. God's Spirit helps us to live in that way. There is no law that says these things are wrong.

We belong to Christ. As a result, we no longer obey our wrong human thoughts. We stop doing the bad things that our thoughts want us to do. It is like we have killed those thoughts on the cross. Now it is God's Spirit that gives us life. So we must let God's Spirit lead us in how we live.

WORSHIP NOTES



David Hayward (@nakedpastor) is a pastor turned artist. The idea behind the name, NakedPastor, is to seek to tell the naked truth—no matter how vulnerable it feels.

“Believe Out Loud” emerged from the Religious Voices Project in 2008. It became a program of the Cathedral of Hope United Church of Christ, known for being the largest LGBTQIA+ church in the world. While “Believe Out Loud” is primarily the name of an organization, it is also associated with a specific hymn written for its launch in 2010. The hymn, also titled “Believe Out Loud,” was composed by David Lohman, who is also known for other songs reflecting his experience as a

queer-identified Christian. “Believe Out Loud,” expresses the organization's mission and commitment to LGBTQIA+ inclusion.



The late **bell hooks** is an acclaimed intellectual, feminist theorist, cultural critic, artist, and writer. Her writings cover topics of gender, race, class, spirituality, teaching, and the significance of media in contemporary culture. Born Gloria Jean Watkins in Hopkinsville, Kentucky, bell hooks adopted the pen name of her maternal great-grandmother, a woman known for speaking her mind. Her books include *Ain't I a Woman: Black Women and Feminism*, *Rock My Soul: Black People and Self-Esteem*, *Teaching to Transgress: Education as the Practice of Freedom*, *Feminism Is for Everybody: Passionate Politics*, *Teaching*

Community: A Pedagogy of Hope, *Where We Stand: Class Matters*, *We Real Cool: Black Men and Masculinity*, and the children's book *Skin Again*.



This morning's anthem is Jasmine Whyte's cover of **Sam Smith's** 2017 *Him*, a song where Smith recounts a story of an imagined boy in Mississippi coming out to his father. The Catholic singer also incorporates the conflict between his sexuality and his religious upbringing. Smith said the track isn't personal, but a narrative meant to convey a specific aspect of the gay experience. "That song is a coming-out song from a boy to his dad," he said. "It's just a general story. It's not my story. I wanted to make that song for my community, for the LGBT community."



In 2022, **Jasmine Whyte**, then aged 23, queered the song, reimagining it as *Her*. Growing up under the influence of Gospel and Jazz, Whyte wrote her first song in elementary school. At the very young age of 8, Whyte began singing independently. Later, her decision to come out as bisexual in high school, and her overall mental health victories influenced many ideas regarding sexual exploration, and celebration within her music. She said, "I believe in Jesus, yes. By believing in Jesus I believe in Love. I feel like as an artist who is lgbtq+ and also a believer in God, there is I suppose one would call a fear directly related to being outcasted.

However, this is who I am, and I am who I am. It didn't take me long to find myself and accept myself for who I am; and I will always be accepting of others for who they are. Regardless, of how I may not always be accepted whole. All I know is Jesus loves me, and he loves you too."

“True Colors,” originally written by Billy Steinberg and Tom Kelly, became a hit for Cyndi Lauper in 1986. The song's meaning centers around accepting and celebrating individuality and authenticity, encouraging people to embrace their true selves without fear. Lauper dedicated the song to her friend who passed away from AIDS, and it has since become an anthem for the LGBTQ+ community, symbolizing self-acceptance and fighting for equal rights.

The hymn **“We Are the Church Alive”** was written in 1980 by Jack St. John and David Pelletier, two musicians from [Metropolitan Community Churches](#) (MCC). It was specifically written for the MCC community and emerged during a time when the MCC was grappling with issues of AIDS. The lyrics reflect a desire to heal and find wholeness. It is now sung in churches worldwide. The hymn emphasizes the church as a living body of people, rather than a building, and celebrates the diversity and inclusivity the church exists to display.

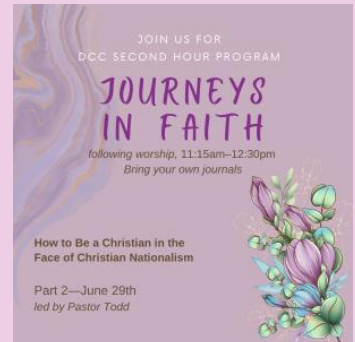

Backpack & School Supplies Drive

Multiple opportunities to bless students in the coming academic year

Don't mention this to your kids or grandkids but it's time for our annual **Summer Backpack and School Supplies Drive** to provide new backpacks stuffed with school supplies for children of homeless, formerly-homeless and at-risk families now living in **Shelter, Inc.** and **Hope Solutions** housing.

Shelter, Inc. has provided us with the names of ten students for "adoption" by folks (individuals, families or groups) at DCC who are ready to shop for a new backpack for him or her and a complete set of grade-appropriate school supplies. Five of the ten have already been taken. Completed backpacks should be **delivered to DCC by 11 AM Sunday, July 20th**, and the Outreach Commission will take care of delivering them to Shelter, Inc.

Shelter, Inc. is also requesting **\$50 gift cards** (Target or Kohl's) for uniforms or clothing and shoes, and you can sign up for these separately. Donations of any amount by check made out to DCC, with "backpacks" in the memo line will be used to purchase gift cards for Shelter, Inc. students. Shelter, Inc. also has an [online sign-up to provide separate school supplies](#) and a [Back to School Drive Amazon Wish List](#) for online purchases.

Hope Solutions also has an option for you to shop for a backpack and items on a checklist of school supplies. Sign up at the [Hope Solutions Backpack Drive 2025](#) sign-up web page (please type "Danville Congregational Church" in the My Comment box) and follow [Hope Solutions' instructions](#), except that you may **deliver your completed backpack to DCC by 11 AM Sunday, July 20th**, and the Outreach Commission will deliver it to Hope Solutions.
