Children - Join us for Godly Play today

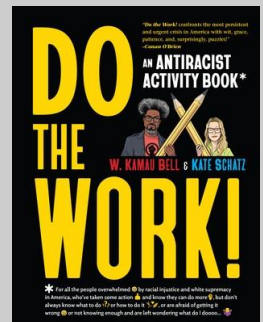
After a wonderful summer and time to settle back into school, we're excited to welcome children back to Godly Play! This fall we're focusing our stories on inspiring people from the Bible.

The DCC Endowment Fund committee will evaluate your request and make a decision based upon its value to our church community. So, send along an idea today!

Please submit your proposal no later than November 24, 2025 for consideration.

Interested in ensuring that more funds are available for church programs in the future? There's no better way than considering a contribution to the fund before year end or making DCC Endowment part of your estate plan.

Here are some contribution options you might consider:

- Charitable gift through a retirement plan (such as an IRA or 401-k).
