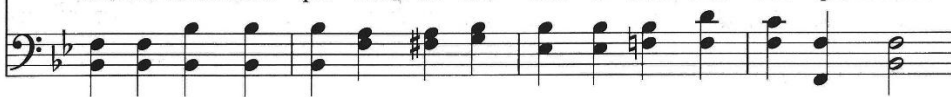

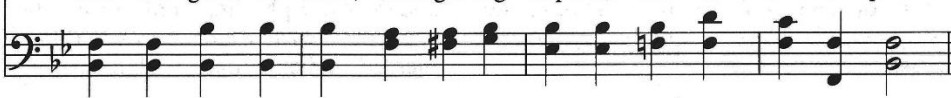

ANCIENT AND MODERN TEXTS IN CONVERSATION

Jesus travelled on from that place and he walked along the shore of Lake Galilee. He climbed up a hill and he sat down there.¹

When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers,
the moon and the stars that you have established;
what are humans that you are mindful of them,
mortals that you care for them?²

It's easy to look at the contours of a forest and feel a
bone deep love for nature.
It's less easy to remember that the contours of your own body
represent the exact same nature.
The pathways of your mind.
Your dreams,
dark and strange as sprouts curling beneath a flat rock.
Your regret,
bitter as the citrus rot of old cut grass.
It's the same as the nature you make time to love.
That you practice loving.
The forest. The meadow. The sweeping arm of a galaxy.
You are as natural as any postcard landscape
and deserve the same love.³

The body is a multilingual being. It speaks through its color and its
temperature, the flush of recognition, the glow of love, the ash of pain, the
heat of arousal, the coldness of non-conviction....It speaks through the leaping
of the heart, the falling of the spirits, the pit at the center, and rising hope.⁴

For all these mysteries, I thank you—
for the wonder of myself,
for the wonder of your works—
my soul knows it well.⁵

And I said to my body, softly, "I want to be your friend."
It took a long breath and replied, "I've been waiting my whole life for this."⁶

Find or make time for yourself to be with yourself. Spend time thinking about
who you are and who you want to be. Examine your strengths and focus on
possibilities. Find the friend inside who has accomplished a lot, and learn to
love yourself on your own terms."⁷

Remember this: Your body is the home—the temple—of God's Holy Spirit.
God gave their Holy Spirit to you and God lives in you.⁸

Your body is the place where the Divine dwells; you always have direct and imminent access to the Divine. That is sometimes comforting, sometimes healing, and sometimes a reminder that you do not have to keep trying to earn love—you can access it, always.”⁹

God will sing, because They are so happy about you!¹⁰
