

NARRATOR 1: In the days when the judges ruled, there was a famine in the land, and a certain man of Bethlehem in Judah went to live in the country of Moab, he and his wife and two sons. The name of the man was Elimelech and the name of his wife Naomi, and the names of his two sons were Mahlon and Chilion; they were Ephrathites from Bethlehem in Judah. They went into the country of Moab and remained there.

NARRATOR 2: But Elimelech, the husband of Naomi, died, and she was left with her two sons. These took Moabite wives; the name of the one was Orpah and the name of the other Ruth. When they had lived there about ten years, both Mahlon and Chilion also died, so that the woman was left without her two sons and her husband.

NARRATOR 1: Then she started to return with her daughters-in-law from the country of Moab, for she had heard in the country of Moab that the LORD had considered his people and given them food. So she set out from the place where she had been living, she and her two daughters-in-law, and they went on their way to go back to the land of Judah.

NARRATOR 2: But Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law,

NAOMI: "Go back each of you to your mother's house. May the LORD deal kindly with you, as you have dealt with the dead and with me. The LORD grant that you may find security, each of you in the house of your husband."

NARRATOR 1: Then she kissed them, and they wept aloud. They said to her,

RUTH: "No, we will return with you to your people."

NAOMI: "Turn back, my daughters, why will you go with me? Do I still have sons in my womb that they may become your husbands? Turn back, my daughters, go your way, for I am too old to have a husband. Even if I thought there was hope for me, even if I should have a husband tonight and bear sons, would you then wait until they were grown? Would you then refrain from marrying? No, my daughters, it has been far more bitter for me than for you, because the hand of the LORD has turned against me."

NARRATOR 1: Then they wept aloud again. Orpah kissed her mother-in-law, but Ruth clung to her. So she said,

NAOMI: "See, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods; return after your sister-in-law."

NARRATOR 2: But Ruth said,

RUTH: "Do not press me to leave you or to turn back from following you! Where you go, I will go; where you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die, I will die-- there will I be buried. May the LORD do thus and so to me, and more as well, if even death parts me from you!"

NARRATOR 1: When Naomi saw that she was determined to go with her, she said no more to her.






Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDoR) was started in 1999 by transgender advocate Gwendolyn Ann Smith as a vigil to honor the memory of Rita Hester, a transgender woman who was killed in 1998. The vigil commemorated all the transgender people lost to violence since Rita Hester's death, and began an important tradition that has become the annual Transgender Day of Remembrance. In recent years, trans activists remind us this day should not just be about remembering those trans kin lost to violence but also to celebrate the resilience of people of trans experience as they endure in their authenticity and persevere.

We observe TDoR as a part of our worship together as a way to not only mourn the lives of those taken from this life through violence but also as an expression of our faith that people of all gender identities and gender expressions are sacred and to commit ourselves as faithful allies of trans people, encouraging compassion, justice, and resilience.



Rev. Dr. David Vásquez-Levy serves as President of Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley, California. One of the UCC seminaries, PSR is a progressive, multi-denominational seminary and center for social justice that prepares theologically and spiritually rooted leaders to work for the well-being of all. A committed pastor, a nationally recognized higher education and immigration leader, and a sought after speaker, Vásquez-Levy leads at the intersection of faith, higher education, and social change. His innovations have led to increase access in theological education and leadership formation. Originally from Guatemala, Vásquez-Levy has lived in four countries, including working on refugee resettlement in Canada, and taught courses and led international study and service trips across the globe.



Dr. Howard Thurman (1899–1991) was an African-American author, philosopher, theologian, educator, and civil rights leader. He served as the first African American dean of chapel at a traditionally white American university and co-founded the first interracial interfaith congregation in the United States—The Church for the Fellowship of All Peoples in San Francisco in 1944. As a prominent religious figure, he played a leading role in many social justice movements and organizations of the twentieth century. Dr. Thurman remained a prolific writer and a popular speaker until his death. Among his many books are *Deep River* (1945), *Jesus and the Disinherited* (1949), *Meditations of the Heart* (1953), *The Creative Encounter* (1954), *The Inward Journey* (1961), *Disciplines of the Spirit* (1963) and *With Head and Heart: The Autobiography of Howard Thurman* (1979).

The Multi-Action Faith Coalition Resources to help fight Hunger Crisis

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits have not been funded for November. The resulting challenge is immediate and devastating. This delay wipes out the food security of 107,000 Contra Costa County residents, over half of whom (55%) are children and seniors. A pause in these crucial benefits forces the most vulnerable among our neighbors to make difficult trade-offs between essential needs, like rent and food.




