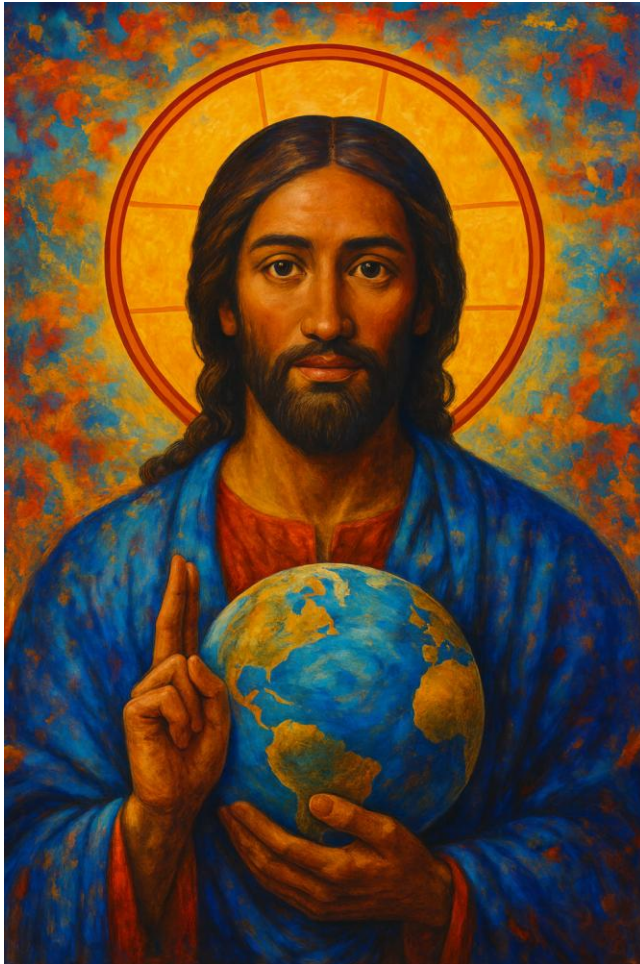

This year is the 100th anniversary of the beginning of the celebration of Christ the King Sunday. The feast day was started to emphasize the Lordship of Jesus Christ in a world of growing ultra-nationalism.

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Lord. Therefore thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the Lord. Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall no longer fear or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the Lord.

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In his days Judah will be saved, and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: “The Lord is our righteousness.”

“Blessed be the Lord God of Israel,
 for God has looked favorably on their people and redeemed them.
 God has raised up a mighty savior for us
 in the house of his child David,
 as God spoke through the mouth of God’s holy prophets from of old,
 that we would be saved from our enemies and from the

WORSHIP NOTES



This week's image, created using chatGPT, is based on the idea of Jesus as *Pantocrator*—a Greek word meaning “Ruler of All”—a specific type of religious image depicting Christ as the all-powerful judge of heaven and earth, common in Byzantine and Eastern Orthodox art. These icons typically show Christ holding a Gospel book and raising his right hand in blessing, with a commanding, often stern, gaze that can simultaneously judge and offer redemption. The term and iconography also appear in various forms across other art traditions, with some later Western works substituting a globe for the book, calling the theme *Salvator Mundi*.

DCC Endowment Looks to Put Funds to Work

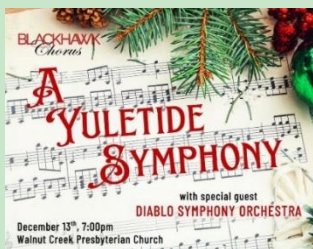

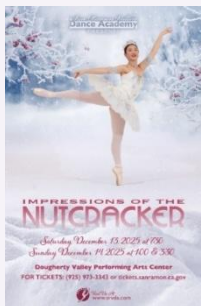
