

Then Peter began to speak to them: “I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every people anyone who fears him and practices righteousness is acceptable to him. You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Sovereign of all. MODERN LESSON

Excerpt from *In My Heart a Volcano*
By Rev. Rhina Ramos

So, we left. As if on an excursion that was going to last a whole month. We traveled in the company of a group of twenty individuals.

When we got to Tijuana, all of us together were put in a safe house. The minute [the coyote who had transported us from El Salvador] left, the Mexican federal police, the *federales*, descended upon us and arrested us.

The police brought us to a cell that had one tiny window that looked out onto the street. I remember feeling despair at having been locked up in a dark, dirty cell, able only to look outside through the tiny window, wanting badly to be set free.

Every other minute [the *federales*] were warning us not to try to escape because they were being sought on both sides of the border for having killed people. They held us in a room with mattresses on the floor. It was dreadful being there. We felt like animals.

On our first attempt to cross the border, I suffered the bitterest cold of my life, to the point that my teeth were chattering. The coyotes ordered us to lie down on the grassy ground. They kept a lookout, waiting for the moment that the gringo border patrol withdrew, so we could attempt the crossing. While we were lying on our stomachs, the wet, frozen ground penetrated my body to the bone. I peed my pants. I was shivering with the icy cold. Never in my life have I felt anything like it.

When we had finally crossed, we made our way, in silence, over mountains, down sidewalks. We had been walking several hours when the coyotes shouted for us to hide. Now we had the border patrol on top of us!

Having been transferred to the third group of coyotes, that same night we repeated our attempt to cross the border. We were walking along a highway when the Mexican federal police intercepted us again. Once more, they took us to the station, and again we had to pay them in order for them to release us.

The *federales* themselves then led us to a sewage outflow culvert that opened right at the foot of the chain-link fence that ran along the border. The boundary we crossed forty years ago doesn't look anything like the concrete wall you see today. We walked for what seemed a half hour. They gestured for us to lie down on the grass near a highway. Shortly thereafter, some cars appeared. We were told to get in and, in a few minutes, we were in San Diego.

We disembarked at a safe house for immigrants who had recently crossed. And there was my aunt, waiting for us. That last leg of the journey my brother and I had made alone. Inside at the safe house, my aunt had lit a candle and, together, she and I went to give thanks to God. Later, she cooked me an egg with Kraft yellow American cheese, the first thing I ate in the United States of America!

Welcoming the Immigrants in Our Communities

Would you like to know how people in Contra Costa and Alameda Counties are responding to the on-going vilification and dehumanization of immigrants in our local communities? A great place to start is the [Immigrant Support Volunteer Opportunities and Resources](#) guide put together by Indivisible ReSisters of Contra Costa. It describes over a dozen volunteer opportunities and provides resources for immigrants and for community members who want to help immigrants. Some of these volunteer opportunities involve expressions of solidarity with immigrants who have cases in the Federal Immigration Court in Concord and some address basic needs like food and transportation. 
