

SCRIPTURE LESSON

Hebrews 11:1-13
 From *The Inclusive Bible*

Faith is the reality of all that is hoped for; faith is the proof of all that is unseen. Because of faith, our ancestors were approved by God.

By faith, we understand that the world was created by the word from God, and that what is visible came into being through the invisible.

By faith, Abel offered a better sacrifice to God than Cain, and for that was declared to be just; God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith Abel still speaks, even though he is dead.

By faith, Enoch was taken up and didn't have to experience death — "he was seen no more because God took him." Even before he was taken, he was commended as one who pleased God. And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to God must believe that God exists, rewarding those who earnestly seek the divine glory.

By faith, Noah — warned about things not yet seen — revered God and built an ark in order to save his household. By faith, Noah condemned the world and inherited the justice which comes through faith.

By faith, Sarah and Abraham obeyed when they were called, and went off to the place they were to receive as a heritage; they went forth, moreover, not knowing where they were going.

By faith, Sarah and Abraham lived in the promised land as resident aliens, dwelling in tents with their children and grandchildren, who were heirs of the same promise — for they were looking forward to the city with foundations, whose designer and maker is God.

By faith, Sarah received the ability to conceive, even though she was past childbearing age, for she thought that the one who had made the promise was worthy of trust.

All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth.

TODAY'S GUEST PREACHER



Rev. Elder Carmarion D. Anderson-Harvey is an ordained minister, pioneering leader, and passionate advocate for marginalized communities. She previously served as the Alabama State Director for the Human Rights Campaign in Washington, DC, making history as the first transgender person of color to hold a senior leadership role in the organization's history.

A steadfast champion for equality, Rev. Carmarion has helped shape local, state, and national policy through direct engagement with the White House. Her nationally recognized work promotes justice, inclusion, and culturally competent outcomes across diverse communities.

As a dynamic public educator and speaker, she has been featured in documentaries, national publications, and major media outlets to raise awareness and inspire transformative change. Her lived experience and ministry calling have been highlighted on CNN's *United Shades of America* with W. Kamau Bell and in an Emmy Award-winning interview with Dyllon Burnside featured in the *Prideland* documentary.

Rev. Carmarion is ordained through The Fellowship of Affirming Ministries (TFAM) and is a Committee on Ministry (COM) Privilege-of-Call candidate with the Southeast Conference of the United Church of Christ (UCC). She is an Associate Pastor (remotely) at First Congregational Church, United Church of Christ, in Birmingham, Alabama. She recently became a staff member in a called position as the Minister for Congregational Leadership with the National Ministries of the United Church of Christ in Cleveland, Ohio.

Her academic background includes Human Services and Ministry/Theology studies at the University of the Cumberlands in Williamsburg, Kentucky. Originally from Dallas, Texas, with deep family roots in Natchez, Mississippi, Rev. Carmarion is a proud mother and grandmother. Her unwavering commitment to inclusion and social justice reflects her divine calling to help build a more just, loving, and equitable world for all.




Sunday, February 15th after worship


